Travel Considerations

Wherever possible, we encourage attendees to travel by public transport.

The closest station is Portsmouth & Southsea, just a couple of minutes walk from Guildhall Square. Many bus routes also stop nearby at Commercial Road South: 1, 2, 3, X4, 7, 8, 13, & 14 from First Bus, and 20, 21, 23, & 700 from Stagecoach.

If travelling from outside the city the Park & Ride is available from the M275, with the PR1 route stopping at Victoria Park in the city centre.



Arrival

On arriving at the Guildhall, please proceed up the Guildhall steps from Guildhall Square and enter through the bronze doors.

Accessible entry will be available in the central door under the Guildhall steps. Please then proceed to the first floor via the lifts for registration.

Registration and refreshments will be on the first floor. On entry, please give your name to one of our team to be signed in.

Andrew Cullen is the Chief Executive Officer at Portsmouth Football Club and joined the club in June 2021.

Andrew has held senior positions in football for the last 25 years, previously working at MK Dons and Norwich City with experience across all four divisions of English professional football. Andrew has also served as a Board Director of the English Football League.

Prior to working in football, Andrew spent 13 years working for Bass, the brewers, in various sales and marketing positions, followed by a short 2 year spell at Midlands based marketing agency, Kilvington Leith Marketing.



Clare Martin

Clare Martin is Chief Executive Officer of Pompey In The Community (PITC)

Clare has worked at Pompey for over 17 years, initially running the Pompey Study Centre and, over time, incorporating the Study Centre into Pompey in the Community.

Pompey in the Community became a charity in its own right in June 2009 and now run coaching, education, inclusion and health programmes that all use the PCFC brand to engage and motivate participants. Each week, during term time, PITC work with over 6,000 youngsters in the Portsmouth area and worked with over 37,000 individuals last year.



Hayden Taylor

Hayden was born and educated in Portsmouth, setting up his first business aged 16. At the age of just 17, Hayden was appointed as the Corporate Relationships Manager for a fast-growing technology start-up called Hubbub, managing large University clients.

At the age of 18, Hayden was selected to represent his company and the United Kingdom at the 'One Young World' global summit in Dublin, the world's pre-eminent global forum for young leaders from 196 countries. He has since attended the global forums in Bangkok (Thailand), Ottawa (Canada) and Bogota, (Colombia).



Sharon Burt

Sharon Burt is Chief Executive Officer of the Solent Academies Trust. She has been a Specialist Leader in Education since 2012 (Leadership and Management, SEND and Safeguarding), and place a high importance on using enquiry led learning as the flywheel to accelerating improvement in the classroom.

Sharon's experience spans a broad range of Special Educational Needs and Disabilities including Autism, speech, language and communication difficulties, complex learning/ medical needs and social, emotional and mental health needs. Specialist expertise also includes sensory integration approaches, attachment awareness and use of PACE.



Temporary Superintendent Paul Markham

Temporary Superintendent Paul Markham leads the Portsmouth district.

Paul has 20 years' experience working for Hampshire & Isle of Wight Constabulary, joining the Portsmouth district in February 2022. Before this Paul was District Commander for the New Forest and the Chief Inspector in charge of the Constabulary's Response and Patrol teams. Paul was also the Bronze Commander for the force's response to Covid-19. Paul has spent his entire career in front-line uniformed policing and his real passion is neighbourhood policing, focusing on tackling crime and offending that impacts the whole community. He is committed to protecting vulnerable members of the community who can often be taken advantage of.



Cllr Steve Pitt

Cllr Steve Pitt is Cabinet Member for Culture, Leisure and Economic Development at Portsmouth City Council.

He has a long history in championing culturally led regeneration and advocating for the cultural and creative industries. Steve is former music venue owner, and worked in various roles within the music industry. He is a professional theatre director and event manager. His Council appointments include a directorship at Solent LEP and Portsmouth Naval Base Property Trust.



Jane Lamer

Jane Lamer is Head of Economic Development and Skills within the Regeneration Directorate of Portsmouth City Council. She originally joined the council in 2019 leading the skills and employment agenda for the local authority and running the extensive unemployment programmes to meet business needs. Starting her career in retail management, Jane moved into business support and training and has over 20 years professional training and delivery experience, including leading business engagement within 2 further education colleges. She has held senior management roles focused on quality in education and partnership. This experience ensures she is passionate about vocational learning and apprenticeships and their role in business growth.



Hannah Prowse

Hannah is the CEO of Portsmouth Naval Base Property Trust, landlord of the Portsmouth Historic Dockyard, operators of the International Boatbuilding Training College in Portsmouth and custodians of the Memorial Flotilla. The Flotilla includes MGB 81 which saw service on DDay, HSL 102 which served at the Battle of Britain and the F8 landing craft from the Falklands conflict (restored with LIBOR funding).

Hannah is also a member of the UK Shipbuilding Skills Taskforce who are developing and implementing a skills strategy for shipbuilding in the UK to ensure the UK's shipbuilding industry has a skilled workforce.



Chris Hillman

Chris is Head of Employability and Apprenticeships at Minstead Trust, which supports over 220 people with learning disabilities to develop skills that allow them to gain greater independence and lead fulfilled lives, including running the Lily&Lime Café in Portsmouth Central Library.

Chris is also Programme Lead for Shaping Portsmouth's Charity Support Network.
